 trainings created by Big Brothers Big Sisters of America.
- Continuing to educate ourselves on the lived experiences of the communities we serve by taking a proactive approach, listening and responding with intention.
- Continuing to develop strategies and best-practices within BBBSRI that identify
 prejudice, discrimination, antagonism and oppression as it exists in our circle of
 influence and the ways in which we can actively work to dismantle it.
- Ensuring that our commitment to cultural humility is reflected in the culture of BBBSRI through our policies, programs and practices as we continue to learn about systematic injustice.

Our obligation is to the young people in our programs who deserve equal and fair treatment in life. From enrolling into BBBSRI and being paired with a caring adult mentor, to applying for scholarships within BBBSRI and externally, to their formal education, personal safety and security, and so much more. As an organization committed to defending the potential of youth we must, and will, remain committed to opposing racism and promoting racial tolerance.
